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Many of these side effects can be managed, and some may go away on their own over time. If you experience symptoms of liver problems such as fatigue, feeling unwell, loss of appetite, nausea, yellowing of the skin or whites of the eyes, dark urine, pale stools, abdominal pain or swelling, and itchy skin, contact your doctor immediately. All of these medications should be taken before meals. Your doctor may do blood tests periodically to monitor the levels of these electrolytes in your blood while you are taking this medication. Do not take a double dose to make up for a missed one. Store this medication at room temperature, protect it from light and moisture, and keep it out of the reach of children.
